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Preface

Chapter 1: A Shepherd's Beginning

- **Humility in Leadership:** David attributed successes not to himself but to God (1 Sam 17:45-47), modeling the humility dimension of authentic leadership (Walumbwa et al., 2008).

3. **Engage:** Seek feedback from trusted voices (Abigail/Nathan moments).
4. **Protect:** Prioritize the vulnerable, addressing systemic risks or inequities.
5. **Humility Check:** Own mistakes and credit team contributions.
6. **Review:** Evaluate outcomes using an ESG and reputation lens.
7. **Deploy:** Strategically align resources with purpose and people.

Chapter 8: Justice as Strategy
